Family Involvement in Knights of Columbus

Dave Boone has been a member of the council's First Degree Team and the Kansas City Area Third Degree Team, each for nearly 14 years. ✓

As Communications Chairman for the council, Dave has published and distributed the council's monthly newsletter for the past nine years. He mails copies to members without internet access and distributes the majority of newsletters via email. Dave also submits all council news items for the parish bulletin. ✓

Dave and Joyce are the pro-life couple for the council. Their activities are described in the community portion of this application. — B

Together, they have attended all state conventions since 1994. Their attendance at council activities is similar. Dave brings refreshments to all council meetings and handles all beverage responsibility for all council Lenten dinners (annually) and parish breakfasts (3-4 annually). Dave volunteers for all free throw contests and Tootsie Roll sales. } B

Dave is also active in the Bishop Ward Fourth Degree Assembly. ✓

Family Involvement within the Church

Dave and Joyce have been members of Holy Spirt parish since it was founded in 1982. Dave is an usher and lector. Dave and Joyce are sacristans and extraordinary ministers.

They are hospital visitors to a nearby hospital and Eucharistic ministers each Sunday to nearby Delmar Gardens Nursing Home where more than 20 Catholics are able to receive communion in their rooms thanks to the Boones.

Two years ago, Dave and Joyce began conducting a weekly communion service at nearby Greenwood Terrace Retirement Home, where up to 25 shut-ins join the Boones for readings from Sunday's Mass followed by communion. } B

They are active participants in the Parish's Adoration Chapel. Joyce helps with all parish funeral dinners and participates in a scripture study class for women of the parish.

For nearly 14 years, Dave and Joyce have been the parish's Respect Life Representatives. Their activities include a baby shower and Life Saver Sunday Collection in January, and Friend's for Life Collection on Mother's Day.

This year they have organized the 40 Days for Life Prayer and a nearby Planned Parenthood facility on two occasions.

They are active volunteers in the parish's Annual Fun Fair, a fall outdoor carnival and picnic with activities intended primarily for elementary school children.

Dave taught religious education classes (formerly known as C.C.D.) in the parish for five years. He is a leader in the parish's Friday morning Men of Faith and Spirit discussion group that meets after Mass. Joyce bakes fresh cookies for the group.

Dave and Joyce are active in the parish's group designed for persons over 50, the Spirit Movers. Dave has been chaplain for the group for nearly eight years. They also participate with other couples in a "small faith group" who meet for monthly scripture study.

Finally, Dave is director of the parish's annual 5-K race and one-mile walk, known as the Dashing Dove, that is held during the weekend celebrating the parish anniversary.

Within the Community

Dave is a member of the Kansas City Kansas Serra Club and the Rotary Club of Shawnee Mission where he served as president. For the past four years Dave has served as president of the Kansas City Track Club. The track club helps 26 area charities raise money for worthy causes by assisting the charities with runs (such as 5-K or one-mile walks). For example, on March 15, nearly 3,000 persons participated in the Annual St. Patrick's Day Run in Kansas City that raised money for Arts Incubator. The event was managed by the track club.

In addition to recruiting more than a dozen members to the council, he takes an active role in welcoming all new members and helping them to become active in council events. He has played a major role in the council's growth to more than 200 members in 14 years.



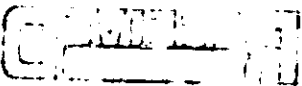

Several years ago during meetings of volunteers from various parishes with the staff at Catholic Charities topic that many families had a real need for major household items but they simply could not afford to buy them. These were items, such as, stoves, refrigerators, washers, dryers, mattresses, dressers, etc., that were still useful but were being sent to landfills when people who were in need of these items could receive benefits from them if there was a means to match donations with needs. The Bible teaches that we must be good stewards of what God has given to us. The problems were many. There were a number of major issues that required answers, such as:

Many times potential donors are unaware of the need for their item;

How can donors get the donation to those in need;

Transportation and storage of a large item,

Also, from an agency perspective, were there agencies or entities already engaged in this type of service?

As a result of these discussions two volunteers, members of Knights of Columbus, Council 11661, with the concurrence of the Executive Director, Catholic Charities, began an effort to determine answers to these and other questions. A number of priests having direct and intimate knowledge of those in need were interviewed. Also, interviews were conducted with staff of non-profit agencies engaged in providing services to low-income families and knew of their needs for quality used furniture and appliances but lacked the means to match them with willing donors. Also, they had no way of moving the items from a donor to the potential recipient. However, there was complete agreement for the need but no agency or entity was providing this service in the Wyandotte or Johnson Counties.

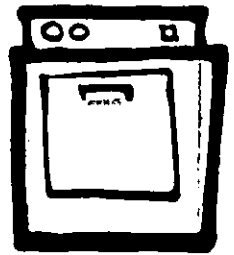
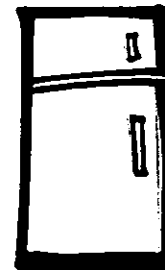
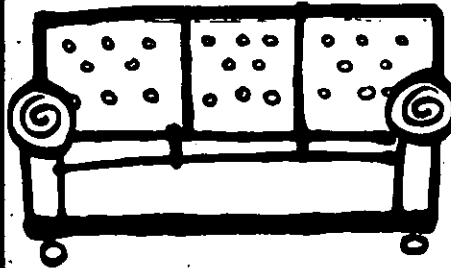
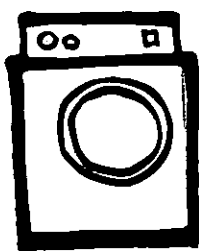
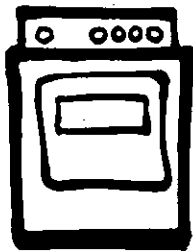
It was determined that the study needed more work and continuation would continue. It was decided that the operation would not compete with existing thrift and discount stores nor duplicate any services now being provided by various non-profits. Further, that collaborating social service agencies would qualify any clients as to need. Only those qualified by Emergency Assistance Centers could purchase items at the store.

A Steering Committee, included a number of Knights of Columbus, was established and accepted the task of bringing the program to reality. Again, all members of the Committee were volunteers and worked with the approval of Catholic Charities. The program as it exists today has the full approval of the Executive Director, Catholic Charities.

One of major problems facing the committee was the need for volunteer manpower for the pickup of donated items. A proposed concept was to to solicit the support of K of C Councils in Wyandotte and Johnson County to assist by providing manpower to do scheduled Saturday pickups. In cooperation with the District Deputies and Grand Knights of the councils in Wyandotte and Johnson Counties this was accomplished. It must be realized that without the Knights of Columbus' help the store would not have become a reality. Currently, a council agrees to participate and with the number of council's it is estimated that each council will participate in 3 or 4 pickups a year, on a rotating basis during the course of a year. The truck is provided by Holy Family Home Furnishings. Each council provides a driver and 1 or 2 loaders and is given a schedule of pickups.

What has the store accomplished? It is used by many social agencies both private and governmental. During this past year we have had over 200 volunteers who donated over 5800 hours. We have been able to serve over 816 families. We average over 40 pickups per month and this is increasing. The Knight's have picked up in all kinds of weather. The store, which was made available through Catholic Charities, is able to display the merchandise and make it a "shopping experience" for the family. A nominal cost is paid for the merchandise. During the initial study this was a topic discussed with all agencies and there was no dissenting comments. We wanted to maintain the customers dignity and self-worth with this concept.

Many stories abound on the benefits provided. They include almost every situation from providing a refrigerator for storing milk for pre-school children to providing mattresses so a family did not have to sleep on a wood floor. Again, one of the key ingredients has been the K of C council's picking up of the donations.(and they picked up fragments which filled twelve baskets.) It is working. Our thanks to all the Knight's who are volunteering to help those in need.

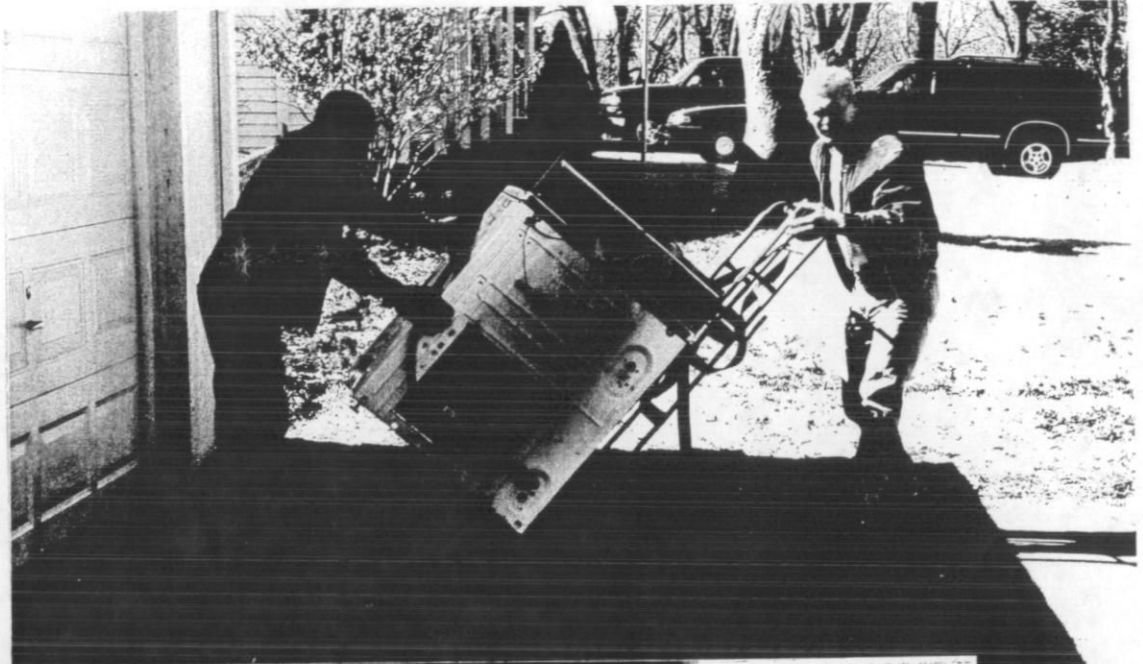

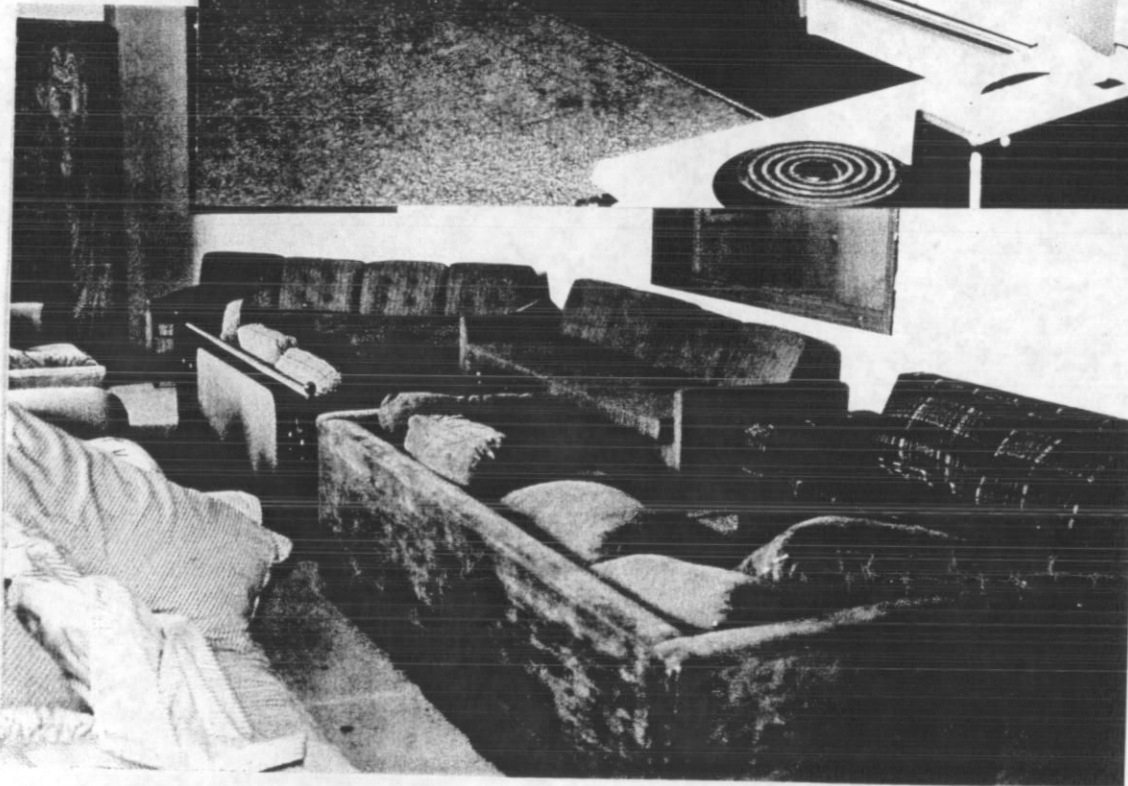

Several years ago during various meetings of volunteers from various parishes with staff at Catholic Charities the concept of utilizing working appliances, washers and dryers, bedroom furniture and mattresses that were being sent to landfills when people who were in need of these items could receive benefits from them if there was a means to match donations with needs. The Bible teaches that we must be good stewards of what God has given to us. The problems were many. Many times potential donors are unaware of the need for their item; how they can get the donation to those in need; transportation of a large item, storing, etc.. Also, were there agencies or entities already engaged in this type of service?

As a result of these discussions two volunteers, members of Knights of Columbus, Council 11661, with the concurrence of the Executive Director, Catholic Charities, began an effort to determine answers to these and other questions. A number of priests having direct and intimate knowledge of those in need were interviewed. Also, interviews were conducted with staff of non-profit agencies engaged in providing services to low-income families and knew of their needs for quality used furniture and appliances but lacked the means to match them with willing donors. Also, they had no way of moving the items from a donor to the potential recipient. However, there was complete agreement for the need. No agency or entity was providing this service in the Wyandotte or Johnson Counties.

It was determined that several volunteers, approved by Catholic Charities, would explore, further, what could be done. It was decided that the operation would not compete with existing thrift and discount stores nor duplicate any services now being provided by various non-profits. Further, that collaborating social service agencies would qualify any clients as to need. Only those qualified could purchase items at the store.

A Steering Committee, included a number of Knights of Columbus, was established and accepted the task of bringing the program to reality. Again, all members of the Committee were volunteers and worked with the approval of Catholic Charities. The program as it exists today has the full approval of the Executive Director, Catholic Charities.

One of major problems facing the committee was the need for volunteer manpower for the pickup of donated items. A proposed concept was to solicit the support of K of C Councils in Wyandotte and Johnson County to assist by providing manpower to man the truck to do Saturday pickups. Working with the District Deputies and Grand Knights of the councils this was accomplished. It must be realized that without the Knights of Columbus' help the store would not have become a reality. Currently, a council agrees to participate and with the number of council's it is estimated that a council will participate in 3 or 4 pickups, on a rotating basis during the course of a year. The truck is provided by Holy Family Home Furnishings. The council provides a driver and 1 or 2 loaders. A schedule of pickups is provided.
